Unlike human clients, a horse won't accept a stroke that's less than perfect. Horses are very sensitive. They don't say much, but through body language they speak volumes. In many ways a horse can be better than a human at teaching you to assess and engage fascial layers with more refinement. Their feedback improves your touch so it's better for your clients, too.

We've been teaching Equine Structural Integration since 1995. Every SI practitioner we've work with, even those in the field for over 20 years, has told us our week-long class with horses as models has significantly improved their touch skills. They learn to read tissue better and work with more presence, engagement, and with less force. When they got home and started seeing human clients again, structural changes came more easily, and clients reported the sessions were noticeably more comfortable.

Every practitioner wants to adeptly assess and work with tissue with minimal discomfort to clients, right? Superbly refined touch skills give FAR better results, and with less wear and tear on your own body.
