

## REQUIREMENTS TO PROGRESS THROUGH EACH LEVEL

After you attend the Level One class, your homework must be completed prior to Level Two.

1. 20 sessions on 7 or more horses. Work on some horses more than once. Fill in an intake form for each horse. The form is in the student notebook you receive during class. Make notes to document the changes you find during and after the sessions.
2. Write a 3 page college-level paper on this topic:  
“What is Structural Integration (SI) and how does it relate to you?”  
Get your research from multiple sources. Think about what you just learned in class, read more on it and then explain your understanding of SI work.
3. Find a local SI practitioner and arrange to get a SI series on yourself so you have a direct experience of the work. Tell us who your SI practitioner is.
4. Read 3-4 books on the Reading List. Especially choose books on topics that are unfamiliar to you so you broaden your understanding of horses. Our expectation is that by completion will have read 10-12 books. Don't wait until Level 3 to start.

### **Due 60 days after Level One**

1. Email your paper. Write your name, L1 course date, and LEVEL ONE at the top.
2. Include a note telling us who your SI practitioner is and what books you are reading.
3. Bring your notes on the sessions to the first day of L2.

### **60 days after Level Two**

1. Email us your paper. Write your name, L2 course date, and LEVEL TWO at the top.  
Write the topic as the title of your paper.
2. Include a note telling us what books you are reading.
3. Bring your session notes to the first day of L3.

### **After Level Three**

1. Within 90 days email your paper. Name, L3 date, topic and LEVEL THREE at top.
2. Complete five series (5 sessions) on 5 horses. Write session notes for yourself.
3. Have you completed your personal SI series (the one you receive)?
4. Once you have satisfactorily completed these requirements, you can be certified, apply for the NBCAAM exam, apply for WA state licensure, and listed as a practitioner on our website.

Tell us how you want your listing to read: name, phone, email, website, email address and where you do sessions. If you travel to different areas regularly, include that. Check the practitioner page of the school site to see how other students' entries look. We do get requests for referrals so please keep your contact info up to date.
